The commission awarded the contract to the software firm Oracle, without going through a competitive bidding process.”

Our county executive, Marc Elrich, refused comment on the matter and refused to step in. We have a corrupt government. Plain and simple.

Just skimming the surface of County spending, I found sole sourced procurements for tens of millions of dollars that have obscene markups. CACI, a database company, was paid \$19M for some computer equipment. CACI doesn't make computer equipment. There is no line item data available from the County's Spending website. So it is like taxpayers paid huge markups for computers that could have been purchased from wholesalers like Egghead.
